MINUTES

- I. The meeting was Called to Order, the Pledge of Allegiance was said and a roll call of those attending via Zoom was taken.

IV. **Health Commissioner Report:** Mr. Migliozi provided a written report to the Board for their review. In addition, Mr. Migliozi reported that the health district had administered over 2,000 vaccines to senior citizens thus far, and have approximately 7,000 more that have registered, but have not yet been scheduled for a clinic. The vaccine is scarce, and with the large demand, the roll out will take time. The first week of clinics did not go as planned; people showed up without appointments, people showed up before their allotted time and there were a few other issues that caused a backup, which resulted in very long wait times for those seeking the vaccination. We reviewed our process, made some adjustments and increased the number of lanes, which we hope will cut down on the wait time and provide a better experience for everyone. With the volume of vaccinations that have been administered through our office, our staff is handling everything well and doing a great job. Mr. Migliozi added that both Directors, Sandy Swann and Kris Wilster, have been working weekends and nights organizing these clinics, in addition to working at the clinics. We will also be looking at holding clinics after hours and on the weekends to accommodate schedules. Due to the amount of hours that both Directors are putting in with regard to the vaccination clinics, Mr. Migliozi requested that the Board authorize the compensation of both Directors, retroactive to January 20, 2021, for hours spent with regard to the vaccination clinics over and above their normal work week.

At this time, Mr. Simon brought up discussion regarding the drive through vaccine clinics. Currently Trumbull County is using the old Bazetta Township Fire Station and tents to administer the vaccinations. Mr. Simon stated that, he was not “knocking” the health district or the staff, but commented that Columbiana County built a building at their fairgrounds to administer their vaccinations. The company that they used is the same one that Trumbull County uses to construct the salt domes. He researched it and a similar structure, with 3-lanes, without electric or heat, would cost approximately \$200,000.00 to construct and could be completed by March. Mr. Simon stated that he feels that the Board should make a request to the County Commissioners to use their COVID funding to construct such a structure. The building can remain after the need for the mass vaccination clinics cease and be used by the fairgrounds for all Trumbull County residents. Mr. Biery responded that the fairgrounds are under the control of the Trumbull County Agricultural Society, and this request should possibly go through them to approach the County Commissioners. Mr. Simon stated that he did reach out to Bud Rogers and he is in favor. Also, Mr. Simon stated that he is unsure that the Trumbull County Agricultural Society should be contacted before the County Commissioners since he believes the buildings and the grounds are owned by the county. Mr. Messersmith stated that he thinks going directly to the County Commissioners would maybe have more of an impact. Mr. Biery agreed, but still stated that he feels the Board should go through the Agriculture Society. Mr. Simon stated that, with the Board’s approval, he would be the point of contact on this request, and that he would work with the Trumbull County Commissioners and the Trumbull County Agricultural Society.

- IX. Board Report:** Mrs. Salapata commended Mr. Migliozi, and the entire health district staff, especially Sandy Swann and Kris Wilster, for all their hard work. Mrs. Salapata stated that she has volunteered at the clinics, and the staff never rested, and it was cold. The staff has also given suggestions to make the clinics better. There were 635 shots administered on Wednesday, January 20th, and 820 plus on Thursday, January 21st. The Wednesday clinic was the first clinic, and there was a very long wait, but by Thursday, the staff had made adjustments and made the clinic better. At today's clinic additional adjustments were made, and the wait time was down to 45 minutes from 5 – 6 hours the prior week. The staff are constantly looking at how to improve the system to make it run more smoothly. This has become a community project, with community members volunteering to assist with the clinics and agencies bringing in refreshments for those working the clinics.

- XI. New Business:** A. Variance Request – Richard Barry, 3967 W. River Rd., Newton Falls – Not present. Due to a property transfer, Mr. Barry is in the process of upgrading the septic system, which will consist of an off-lot system. Due to the property transfer, an inspection was required by the plumbing inspector. Upon inspection, the plumbing inspector noted that the home had major plumbing issues, and suggested that the old cast iron building drain be replaced and rerouted through the side wall of the basement. This is located on the south side of the house, which is less than 10 feet from the property line, and the water well is on the other side of the house. Therefore, upon laying out the

system, it was determined that the septic system could not be installed to comply with the state code on setback requirements from the property line.

B. Variance Request – George Chittle, 7877 Girdle Rd., Mesopotamia Twp. – Not present. As a result of a well application for construction of a new private water system, an inspection was conducted. Upon inspection, the inspector noted that a hand pump remained, and had not yet been sealed. The inspector informed the owner that if he wished to keep the hand pump well that he would have to request a variance, but no request was received. An in-house administrative hearing was held on January 30, 2020, but no one attended. On February 4, 2020, Board's Findings & Orders were issued ordering Mr. Chittle to submit a completed Ohio Department of Natural Resources Sealing Report within 30 days, and contact the inspector to schedule a water test. The owner did not comply with the Findings & Orders, and charges were filed on September 2, 2020. On December 17, 2020, the owner filed an application for a variance from OAC Section 3701-28-17(A) of the Private Water System Rules, which requires abandonment and sealing of a private water system that is not providing a source of water for human consumption. The owner is requesting a variance to allow him to keep the original hand dug well, and use it to water his livestock. Health department inspector, Rod Hedge, stated that the hand pump does not work and he has a concrete lid over the well. Mr. Chittle wants to keep it because the house is historical. Mr. Migliozi stated that the owner has a right to request a variance for historical reasons, but that he would have to make the pump operational.

Atty. Kokor suggested that the Board table any action on Mr. Chittle's variance request until he makes the hand pump operational.

C. Declaration of Unfit for Human Habitation – 300 Hayes Ave., McDonald, Kevin Wyndham, Owner – Not present. A request was made by McDonald Village Officials to determine if the structure was fit for human habitation. An inspection was conducted on December 9, 2020, and the inspector noted rodent and/or insect infestation and gross unsanitary conditions. Mr. Hedge stated that the structure is infested with bugs and is unoccupied.

D. Declaration of Unfit for Human Habitation – 5040 Mahoning Ave., Champion Twp. (Former Champion Skating Rink), Keith Brainard, Owner – Mr. Brainard was present via Zoom. A request was made by Champion Township Zoning to determine if the structure was fit for human habitation. An inspection occurred on December 7, 2020, and the inspector noted missing or badly damaged ceiling tiles, walls and/or flooring (the walls and ceiling were in collapse), mold and moisture contamination, gross unsanitary conditions and that the structure had burnt down and was in collapse. Mr. Brainard stated that due to insurance reasons, he is unable to do anything with the structure because the fire marshal as yet to issue his report. Mr. Brainard stated that he has requested that the insurance company put up a fence, but they have refused; and, he cannot tear down the structure because the cause of the fire is still under investigation and there may be evidence regarding the cause.

Atty. Kokor stated that the board of health has been asked to declare the structure unfit, and that is the board's sole function, then the matter is returned to the township. The board of health does not tear it down.

Mr. Biery added that he understood the issues that Mr. Brainard had pointed out, but all the board can do is declare it unfit if it is found to be unfit.





Health Commissioner's Report – January 27, 2021 Board of Health Meeting

1) Budget/Financial

- Attached is the monthly financial report for December 2020. The general fund is at a positive cash balance of \$665,649.91, and our all fund balance at \$2,691,116.94. The general fund balance includes a transfer in from various grants of \$267,522.00.

2) Credit Card

- Quarterly update on the credit status has not changed.

- Attached is the cost analysis for the month of December for the vehicles. The overall cost savings with the vehicles, for the month of December was \$466.17, with a year to date savings of \$9,290.84.

7) COVID-19 (Coronavirus)

- Trumbull County began vaccinating Tier 1A, which included healthcare workers, congregate living sites, people with developmental disabilities and those with mental health disorders and EMS responders, the week of December 28, 2020, and the health district held our first clinic for Tier 1A on January 6, 2021. We are approximately 75% through those that registered in Tier 1 A, and are holding additional clinics with the vaccine that is allocated for this tier as it is received.
- In conjunction with Ohio's statewide efforts to distribute COVID-19 vaccines to Ohioans in Phase 1B starting the week of January 19th, the Trumbull County Combined Health District, the Warren City Health District, Trumbull County EOC, Mercy Health and Steward Health held a joint press conference on Friday, January 15, 2021, to announce the Tier 1B vaccine providers in Trumbull County, and how to register with those providers. Those providers will be our agency, the Warren City Health District, Trumbull Regional Medical Center, Mercy Health and Giant Eagle Pharmacies in Trumbull County. We have estimated that there is approximately 50,000 persons who would be potentially eligible to receive the vaccine in this phase.
- The combined total of doses for our 80 and older residents is 2,300, and clinics will begin to be held on Tuesday, January 19th. Vaccine is scarce, and the roll out will take time, but everyone is committed to making sure that what vaccine is received in a week is administered to Trumbull County residents in that week.
- Trumbull County will begin vaccinating Tier 1B individuals as follows: Week of January 19th – Ages 80 & Older; Week of January 25th – Ages 75 & Older and those with severe congenital, developmental or early onset medical disorders; and Week of February 1st – Ages 70 & Older and employees of K-12 schools that wish to remain or return to in-person or hybrid learning by March 1st.
- We have asked anyone wishing to register for our clinics to either call our COVID Vaccine Line at 330-675-7844, or on our website www.tcchd.org.
- Our staff has scheduled 1,158 residents to be vaccinated in a two-day period at our 80 & older clinics that are scheduled for Wednesday, January 20th, and Thursday, January 21st, out at the Trumbull County Fairgrounds.
- Weekly calls continue with other Ohio Health Commissioners with the Governor's office reviewing more recent strategies that are being instituted to combat COVID-19.

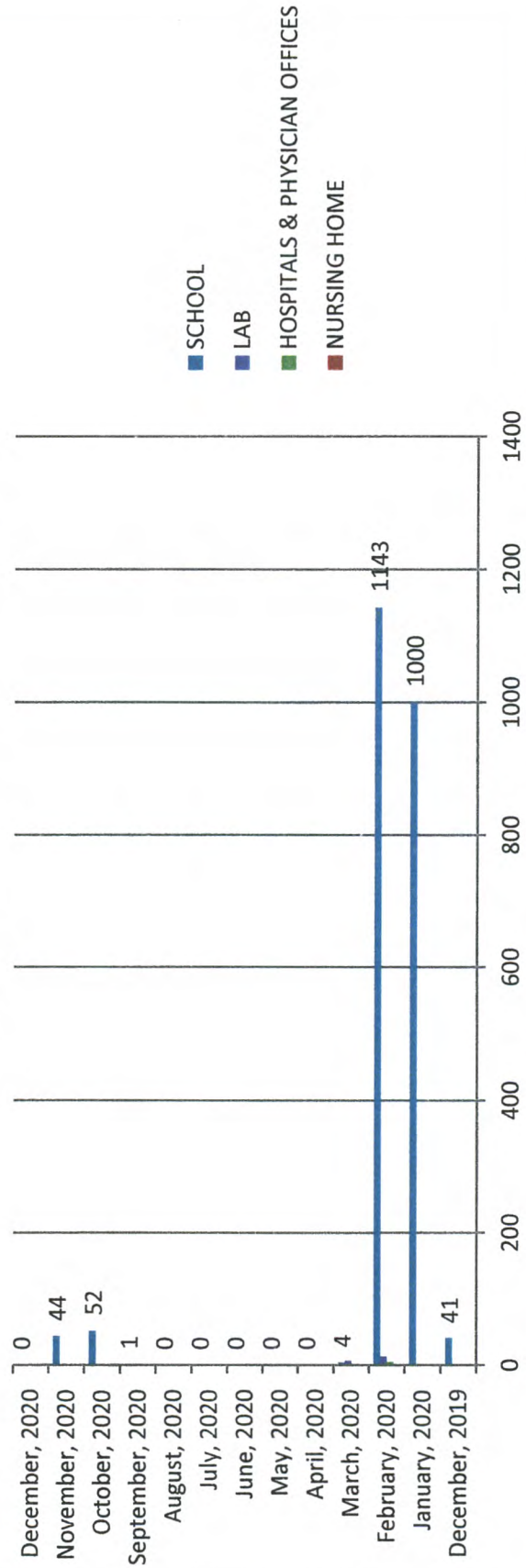
